

SSLP Student Ambassador

The Southwark Schools' Learning Partnership (SSLP) is looking for one or two ambitious Year 10 students to represent your school's student body on the SSLP Student Council, and also to represent the SSLP back to your students. Ambassadors will need to be in regular contact with the SSLP coordinator, will receive the weekly e-newsletter and will have responsibility for some student-focused events. Students will develop the competencies by completing the tasks below.

Communication

- Building the profile of SSLP with students by leading an assembly in the first term
- Advertising and promoting SSLP opportunities to relevant students
- Recruiting interested students to help run opportunities and events hosted by own school
- Writing short reports on SSLP events that your school hosts or attends for school website and newsletter, and for the SSLP website and newsletter

Creativity

- Designing posters and social media to encourage student engagement with SSLP events
- Opening lines of communication with fellow students so you can represent your school

Independence

• Actively seeking new opportunities

Leadership

- Attending SSLP Student Council meetings at least once per term
- Taking collective responsibility and implementing decisions made by the Student Council
- Committing to a full year of service
- Facilitating either a Thinking About or a So You Want To Be event each academic year
- Supporting the delivering of all events that are offered by your school
- Ensuring students from your school are represented at a variety of SSLP events
- Be visible and known to staff and students

Listening

- Actively seeking input from fellow students on topics to be discussed by Student Council
- Reporting regularly to the SSLP Staff Champion

Numeracy

Monitoring and recording pupil engagement across the year

Presenting

- Discussing one topic per meeting and sharing your school's experience
- Presenting at school assemblies

Teamwork

Collaborating with Ambassadors in other SSLP schools

You will receive communication training, an Ambassadors pin badge and (on completion) a certificate of competencies and engagement. This role is the equivalent of a prefect role.
